On Saturday, 08-28-201 at 1622 hours I was dispatched to 806 Shelton Ct. Albany, GA 31705 in reference to family violence. I arrived at 1632 hours and contacted Evon Whitley (B/F, DOB: [REDACTED], who resides at 806 Shelton Ct. Albany, GA 31705) who was standing in the roadway in front of the residence. Evon Whitley said that she and her mother Phyllis Banks (B/F, DOB: [REDACTED], who resides at 806 Shelton Ct. Albany, GA 31705) had been fighting. Evon Whitley said that Phyllis Banks threw a shoe and hit her. I then made contact with Phyllis Banks inside of the residence. Phyllis Banks said that Evon Whitley became upset because she would not let her go to a football game. Phyllis Banks said she was in her bedroom lying across the bed when Evon Whitley came to her bedroom door yelling at her demanding she tell her why she could not go. Phyllis Banks said she explained to Evon Whitley why she couldn't go and asked her to leave her doorway. Phyllis Banks said Evon Whitley refused to leave and continued yelling at her. Phyllis Banks said she threw a shoe (A tan sandal with wedge heel) at Evon Whitley. Phyllis Banks said that the shoe hit Evon Whitley on the foot. Phyllis Banks said Evon Whitley ran into her bedroom and began to hit her. Phyllis Banks said she got off the bed and attempted to push Evon out of her bedroom. Phyllis Banks said Evon Whitley continued hitting her. Phyllis Banks said she then grabbed Evon Whitley and threw her to the floor and hit her with the shoe. Phyllis Banks said she then got up and grabbed Evon Whitley and pulled her out of the bedroom into the living room, and told her oldest daughter Evetta Whitley (B/F, DOB: [REDACTED], who resides at 806 Shelton Ct. Albany, GA 31705) to call the police. At 1642 hours I contacted Sgt. R. Curry and notified him of the incident. Sgt. Curry arrived on scene at 1653 hours. We then spoke with Evon Whitley again. Evon Whitley then said that during the altercation Phyllis Banks threw a portable police radio at her. Evon Whitley said the radio didn't hit her. Evon Whitley said she doesn't remember exactly all the places she was struck at with the shoe, and the exact number of times she was struck. Evon Whitley had a large contusion approximately 6-8 inches on the right side of her forehead. Sgt. R. Curry contacted Det. C. Kirkpatrick and notified him of the incident. I also made contact with Evetta Whitley who said she didn't see the physical altercation but that she heard Evon Whitley yelling at her mother. Evetta Whitley said she also heard Phyllis Banks ask Evon Whitley to leave her room several times. Evetta Whitley said she went to the doorway and asked Evon Whitley to leave their mother alone, but Evon Whitley refused to do so. Evetta Whitley said she did not want to make a written statement. I also checked Phyllis Banks for physical injuries. She received a scratch approximately 5 inches to the left side of her face and two scratches approximately 5-6 inches each on her chest just above the neckline of the front of her shirt. I took photographs of their injuries. I then placed Phyllis Banks under arrest for Battery OCGA 16-5-23.1. I handcuffed, searched, and placed her in the backseat of my patrol car. I transported her to the Dougherty County Jail and charged her with Battery OCGA 16-5-23.1 on Warrant No. 13793DCP. I also took Phyllis Banks' shoes from her to log into evidence at DCP Headquarters. Prior to leaving the jail I checked the backseat of my patrol car for contraband, weapons, and other items with negative results. I also completed a victim notification form. The shoes were logged into evidence at DCP Headquarters on Receipt No. 6309 and stored in Locker No. 001. This incident is turned over to Detective, C. Kirkpatrick for further investigation.
